Chaplain's Message:

- No Report

Grand Knight Messages (Steve Rodenbeck):

- Knight of the Month-May: Mike Groh in acknowledgement for his years of service as Recorder for the council and involvement in other activities.
- Concerning the Measure-Up campaign Steve felt this to be a REAL challenge because of Kroger's New Policy changes and Limitations on "WHO" can collect inside their stores. Steve got together with Trustees, devised and sent out letters to several Organizations and Businesses this year. Also had a committee spearheaded by Steve Kruse. Would like to thank the Trustees for their Help on this Project. Previous years have Totalled amounts ranging from \$3500.00 - \$4000.00. Tonight, Steve is turning over \$6388.58, the amount we have already collected this year. More contributions may still be coming.
- During attendance at the State Convention in Cincinnati there was statewide concern on "How this program is being handled. State would like to develop a more uniform policy throughout the State.

Member News:

- The June business meeting attendance prize winner was Rev. Michael Flick. He was not present to win the \$20. Next month's attendance prize will be \$25.
- Split the Pot, worth \$51, was won by Paul Beck.
- Approx. 32 members were in attendance.
- 10 members prayed the Rosary in Church before the meeting.
- \$32 was collected for Support the Seminarians.

- **Treasurer and Financial Secretary Report**
- Beginning Balance for May was \$32,194.43. Ending Balance was \$28,982.81. Expenses were \$2,740.25. Income was \$529.00.
- John Hughes: The Audit Report is 98% done. A \$100 was received from Supreme as well as another sticker for the plaque.
- Currently have 163 members; 12 members were dropped; we are carrying 3 inactive (Insurance) members;
- There are no changes to the Program Directors for the new Fiscal Year.
- Concerning the Budget: Income was budgeted at \$28,000; actual Income was \$43,316. Budgeted expenses were \$26,100. Actual expenses were \$31,840.
- Going forward, concerning reimbursement for your Bills, **no check will be written without a receipt.**
- Concerning Bills, Paul Beck asked if we would pay for a new Freezer (\$444.) for TRAM. This was not a budgeted item; it was voted upon and unanimously approved.

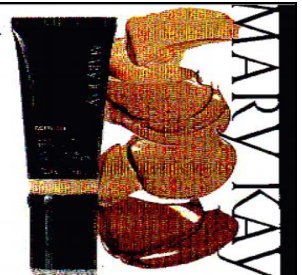
